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Junior & Open Exhibit Rules

1. Entry is open to community members residing in Grant, Iowa and Lafayette Counties or members enrolled in a 4-H Club or FFA Chapter based in Grant, Iowa or Lafayette Counties.
2. Entry fee will be \$3.00 per exhibitor
3. There is no limit on the number of entries, however only one entry per lot will be allowed.
4. Additional fee of \$1.00/head will be charged for dairy cattle.
5. Junior exhibitors are considered Pre-K to 12th grade. Anyone older is considered Open Class. Exhibitors may not enter both Junior and Open classes.
6. Junior Class exhibitors shall be entered according the grade enrolled on January 1, 2021.
7. Dairy Cattle must be in place by 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 11th, show will start at Noon.
8. Entry tags and prize ribbons must be left on exhibits until time of release. Entries will be released at 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 11th and must be picked up by 5:00 p.m. that day.
9. Ribbons and cash prizes will be awarded for Open Departments for first, second and third places only.
10. Danish judging will be used for Junior Departments.
11. The Dairy Days committee will take every precaution for the safe keeping of exhibits but will not be held responsible for any exhibit material that is damaged, lost or destroyed in any matter.
12. The Dairy Days committee reserves the right to interpret the rules.

- ◆ The Platteville Dairy Days Dairy Cattle Show is open to youth in grades up to 12th grade as of January 1, 2021, who reside in Grant, Iowa or Lafayette counties or are members of FFA or 4-H clubs based in those counties. Membership in 4-H, FFA or breed association is NOT required.
- ◆ In addition to the \$3.00 exhibitor fee, there will be a \$1.00/head entry fee.
- ◆ Cattle must be in place by 11:00 am with the show starting at 12:00 (Noon) on Saturday September 11, 2021. Cattle will be released at 4:00 p.m.
- ◆ Registered and grade animals will be shown together.
- ◆ There is no electricity or wash racks available. There will be drinking water available for the cattle.
- ◆ All bedding MUST be picked up following the show.
- ◆ No person shall exhibit any animal afflicted with or exposed to any contagious or infectious disease. Visit https://datcp.wi.gov/Pages/Programs_Services/FairsShowsSpecialEvents.aspx for a complete set of rules pertaining to animal health regulations.
- ◆ Premise ID and individual animal ID must be listed on the entry form.

- ◆ The Platteville Dairy Days Dairy Goat Show is open to youth in grades up to 12th grade as of January 1, 2021, who reside in Grant, Iowa or Lafayette counties or are members of FFA or 4-H clubs based in these counties. Membership in 4-H, FFA or breed association is NOT required.
- ◆ In addition to the \$3.00 exhibitor fee, there will be a \$1.00/head entry fee.
- ◆ Only (1) animal may be entered under each lot number.
- ◆ Premise ID and individual animal ID must be listed on the entry form.
- ◆ All goats must be identified with official scrape ear tags, other official scrapie identification or registration tattoos. All goats that are tattooed must have a copy of registration paperwork available at check-in. All official ID must be in ear or approved location.
- ◆ Goats must be in place by 11:00 am with the show starting at 12:00 (Noon) on Sunday, September 12, 2021. Goats will be released at 4:00 p.m.
- ◆ There is no electricity or wash racks available. There will be drinking water available for the animals.
- ◆ Exhibitors are responsible for providing their own pens or kennels or showing from their own trailers.
- ◆ All exhibitors of goats must have POSSESSION by May 1st of the show year, with the exception of Jr. Kids.
- ◆ Dairy goats with natural horns may not be entered.
- ◆ All does over 24 months must have kidded to be shown.
- ◆ Any inappropriate actions, as determined by Dairy Days Committee, toward your animal may result in disqualification.
- ◆ No person shall exhibit any animal afflicted with or exposed to any contagious or infectious disease.

- ◆ Danish System judging will be used for breed classes.

 - Yearling milkers; under 2 years old, in milk
 - Junior milkers; at least 2 years old, but under 3 years old, in milk
 - Mature milkers; at least 3 years old, but under 5 years old,
 - Aged milkers; 5 years old and older

Bouquets and Arrangements

- Bouquets and arrangements are considered to be more formed and artistically arranged.
- Arrangements and bouquets will be judged 75% on horticultural quality and 25% on arrangement design skills.
- The use of accessories such as container/vase, ribbon, floral foam may be used, however should not be the main content of the bouquet/arrangement.
- All fresh content such as foliage and flowers must be grown by the exhibitor with the exception of Lot 28.
- No commercial fresh product may be used.

Plant Crafts

- Commercial product may be purchased in parts, but the exhibit as a whole needs to be created and cared for by the exhibitor.

- No freezer jams or jellies allowed.
